- The Charity Quilt area that we had in North Little Rock was wonderful. Because of the facilities, we were able to turn it into an actual quilt display. This time everyone had a chance to look at every quilt. We tried to display the patriotic quilts together since these were going to Brooke Army Medical Center for their "Quilt of Valor" program. We have had a wonderful chance to give to this for the past three years. Because our quilt count was not high this past rally (264), we were only able to send 37 quilts to San Antonio. Desi Gipson was there with a well-stocked area representing the Quilt Blossom Quilt Shop. There were two amazing bead companies represented as well. Kittie Finch from Kittie's Kreations was there as well as Penny Harper with the Argenta Bead Company. All three shops were there to give demonstrations and to answer all questions that people came with.
- September 27<sup>th</sup> started out being a very informative day for all of us. Sharon Eversmann gave a fabulous presentation on making small quilts. We had 50 chairs for her presentation and every one of them was filled. The quilt social that was put on that afternoon by Q.U.E.S.T. Quilters and the Arkansas Quilt Guild was wonderful. Members of both guilds gave demonstrations on everything from "English Paper Piecing" to "How to Color Your Quilt with Crayolas." They provided cookies, cakes, bread, dips and chips. There was so much food that we were able to share a two-day supply with the commercial vendors. In addition to the demonstrations and the food, several people brought award-winning quilts for everyone to look at. The room was packed but no one seemed to mind; all had a good time and everyone is looking forward to the charity quilts in Shawnee, Oklahoma.
- Ann Bailey, the Quilt Area Chairperson, has great news for everyone. Rosa Truhe and her husband, Tom, F288221 have donated fabric to be used for quilts for 2009. There are 24 boxes of beautiful quilting fabric ready to be used. There are 16 boxes weighing 15 to 20 pounds and 8 boxes weighing 30 to 35 pounds. Ann is happy to ship them to your chapter for you to use for the rally in Shawnee, Oklahoma. Don't worry- she has offered to ship them at her expense.
